Treasurer's Report for the month ended 31st December 2025



Cash Flow for the month of December resulted in an increase of \$14,827.57 due to Membership Subscriptions received. We currently have 5 Life Members, 253 Home Members, and 33 Away Members. Membership renewal fees collected total \$19,826.80.

Annual QBA and ABF Levies payable as at 31 March estimated \$13,725.60 (i.e. 258 x [\$26.60 x 2]).

CLIVE BERGHOFFER AO PATRON of the TOOWOOMBA BRIDGE CLUB

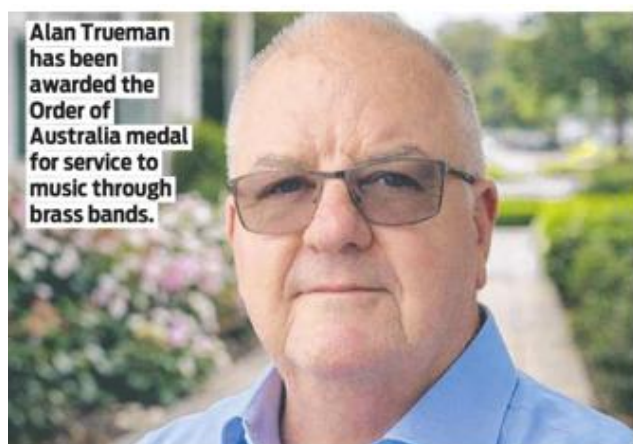


For those members who are relatively new to the Toowoomba Bridge Club, the following is a synopsis of what Clive Berghofer has contributed towards our club and why we are so fortunate in having him as our Patron.

There is a detailed explanation of Clive Berghofer's contribution to our building fund in the Bridge Club History, but briefly, after he had already agreed to fund the air-conditioning (\$70,000), just prior to the commencement of construction a quantity surveyor gave us a new update on costs and at that point, we found we were \$55,000 short. When we approached Clive and explained our problem, he brought all his construction workers back from leave and had them do all the site works given that the site for the club was on a sloping hill, in preparation for the builder. Problem solved. When the club started fund-raising in 2004, we had \$110,000 – the final cost including building, gardens & car parking was well in excess of \$700,000.

Since then, each year he has contributed \$1000 towards the prize money for Patron's Day with the club contributing another \$500.

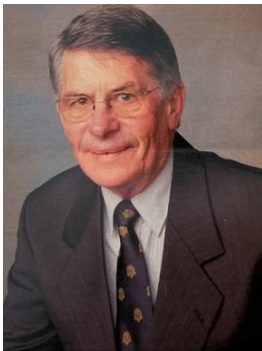

Contestants entering this event are deemed to have agreed to abide by the Regulations of the QBA and any supplementary regulations made by the Congress organisers and either posted on the QBA website, appearing on the entry form, or by announcement before the start of the event.



Date Claimers

- **Club Teams Championship:** Sunday 1st February (two sessions) starting at 9:30am. This is an honour board event with recognition for Open, Restricted (<300) and Novice teams. If there are at least six teams in each field, then we will run as separate events, otherwise we all play together in the one field but with separate honour board recognition. BYO lunch and a few nibbles to share. We usually have drinks, nibbles and a chat afterwards.
- **GNOT (Grand National Open Teams):** Friday afternoons 6th & 13th February. Nominate a team of four, five or six players to play in this club event. If someone can't play both weeks you may use other people/or pairs provided you do not exceed six in total.

The GNOT is run by the ABF for members of clubs all around Australia and is the only event where you can earn gold masterpoints playing in your own club against your peers. There are about 1700 teams (7000 players) that start this event – making it one of the largest in the world.

Toowoomba club has two more qualifying heats, Heat B on Wednesday Afternoons 11th & 18th March, and Heat C on Tuesday Nights 21st & 28th April.

The winners of these club heats earn the right to advance to the Zone Final (against top teams from the other participating clubs in our zone – Darling Downs, Dalby, Warwick, Stanthorpe, Roma, Lockyer, Goondiwindi). The top two teams from our zone final earn the right to advance to the “National Qualifying Final” in September and the top 8 teams after that play in the National Final in Brisbane in November. The 12 highest placed non-metropolitan teams also play in an event in November.
- **Patron's Day:** Saturday 21st February
This is a two-session event for all club members. It is divided into three grades with recognition for the winners and prizes (\$250, \$150 and \$100) in each grade. The winners of the Open section are also recognised as the winners of the Clive Berghofer Pairs.
- **Zone Pairs Qualifier:** Sunday 1st March.
Open to members of all clubs in our zone, although it will mostly be Toowoomba folk. Play for red masterpoints locally, plus the top few pairs qualify for subsidy to play in the Queensland Open Pairs in October. If you don't want to play in the state final your place is offered to the next qualifier.
- **Ivy Dahler Cup:** Three Monday afternoons 2nd, 9th & 16th March for red masterpoints. The field will be divided into two grades (Open and Novice). Actual format depends on the number of entries but will involve one session of qualifying. The top 12 pairs in each grade then play in a two-session final whilst the remaining pairs play regular bridge (still for red masterpoints).

- **Tuesday Night Pairs Competition:** 17th & 24th March for red masterpoints.
- **Toowoomba X-IMP Pairs congress:** Sunday 22nd March. I have managed to secure Jo Neary (from Toowong) to be our Director, so I might actually get to play (if someone will have me). In the past, this has been a Butler Pairs event. That is a method of scoring (named after Geoffrey Butler from the British Bridge Union) where your score was compared to the average of everyone else in the room and then scored by International Match Points – it was a bit like the average in the room were your team-mates. X-IMP means cross-IMP scoring, where your score is compared to each other table and then your final score is the average of all of them. Don't worry, the computer and bridgemates do all of the scoring, and I will show a full example in the next newsletter.

All these events are listed on our website in the “Calendar” area, are usually listed on the website front page, often have a flyer on display in the clubrooms, and are announced by the Directors (should be at the start of each session). They are also mentioned on the TV announcements when these TV's are switched on. Despite this, word of mouth remains the best way to get people involved, so always make sure you gee-up your friends to play 😊
