The Club has enough working capital to cover all its running expenses and for anyone interested in the clubs financial statements they are attached to the Minutes posted on the notice board at the club.

As we have a 10x10 year lease on the premises, and the building is being depreciated by the Auditor over 20 years, the reserves that were built up over the last few years have been spent on the car park extension so we now need to build them up again and in the meantime be somewhat prudent in our spending.

The Club provides first class premises and equipment which all the members enjoy. The use of the club is increasing every year, which means there will be a corresponding increase in the wear and tear leading to more maintenance and replacement of expensive assets.

I encourage members to volunteer to help, even in some small way, as this helps improve our financial position.

Masterpoint Secretary

Our Directors give an indication of the masterpoints when a session is scored and results displayed. These are checked at the end of each month before final calculation. Sometimes adjustments must be made to comply with ABF Masterpoint Regulations. I also combine all the results from each day to determine the Monthly (Eclectic) Event winners.

Masterpoints are then processed and sent to the ABF for allocation to players. As an example, in December, 121.31 green masterpoints were calculated from 33 sessions and allocated to 209 players. December is always a quiet month.

It would be good if we could support our neighbouring clubs whenever possible. Have you considered taking a car load of players for a visit to one of their regular sessions (phone first to confirm session times)? I am sure they will make you most welcome.

The Darling Downs Zone has responsibility to run local qualifying rounds for two national events and two state events.

Queensland Open Teams:

Players from all zone clubs can play in the qualifying event held on **Sunday 17th June**. The top two or three teams are then supported to play in the State Championship on 24/25 August.

Queensland Open/Novice Pairs:

Players from all zone clubs can play in the qualifying event held on **Sunday 29th July**. The top two or three pairs are then supported to play in the State Championship on 20/21 October.

GNOT (Grand National Open Teams):

Club Qualifier is on Saturday 21st & 28th April. Top one or two teams then playoff in the zone final on Sunday 9th September. Winning team then plays in the national final 30 Nov – 3 Dec.

GNP (Grand National Pairs):

For players below Life master ranking. Club Qualifiers are a three session event. Either: Wednesday 4th, 11th & 18th July. Saturday 4th, 11th & 18th August.

Many players then qualify for the zone final to be held on Sunday 11th November. Top two pairs then play in the national final in Canberra in January 2013.

Playing the Margetts Coup by Edwin Willey

As West you hold: Spade: KT542, Heart: 3, Diamond: A52 and Club: 6432, you hear this brisk bidding:

 2 Showing two aces and two kings of the same colour.

So you set about selecting a lead. The swift auction suggests that opponents are obviously fairly confident. But lets analyse what they have said to each other. They have a great heart fit, and North holds two ace and two kings of the same colour. So, barring error in responses, North has the black aces and the red kings. You require two tricks to set the contract; the diamond ace is one, you need another. Your king of spades may be looking down the gurgler of a later finesse. So you give declarer a fundamental decision at trick one and you lead the S5.

Dummy goes down: A9 KT874 K3 AJ97

Fingers crossed: perhaps partner may hold SQ.

South holds:	QJ

South knows very well that no person ever makes an initial lead away from a king especially in a slam. South thinks about options, and decided to refuse the spade finesse, and hopes that dummy's clubs will provide the necessary spade discard from hand.

South has just become victim of the infamous Margetts Coup. However, whatever one does, there is a beauty in the spade lead, given the knowledge of North's holding; as West you may find your spade king subject to a finesse.

Marg Margetts a long-standing player of the TBC could find the most fiendish of leads. On one occasion when I was in a spade slam, she led a small heart (from her king, of course) through dummy's AQJ. As declarer, I rose with the ace and explored another available option for my 12 tricks, which failed. All I needed to do was to take the finesse at trick one.

So I was caught in the Margetts Coup again.
