MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTIONS 2016

To qualify for the Birthday Club in 2016 you need to be a member of the club by the 31st December, 2015. We bought this rule in when it was first started because it is unfair if members join partway through the year after their birthday.

To ensure you are registered with the Australian Bridge Federation, members will need to pay their membership subscriptions by the end of February. Subs are actually due by the 1st January, but we have always allowed a little leeway on this. You can pay at the club, by post or bank transfer.

Paying by Bank Transfer

Heritage has made life a little interesting for people trying to pay by bank transfer.

- If you are paying from any other bank, then just use BSB = 630-070, Acct = 10157956.
- If you are using the Heritage Transfer between Heritage Accounts (as many people try to do), then Member Number = 10157956, Account = S21.

• If you are using Heritage but using the "Interbank Transfer" option, then Account Name = Toowoomba Bridge Club, BSB = 630-070, Account Number = 10157956 ... and then Heritage will recognise it is one of their own accounts and will add the S21 on itself.

As at the end of June 2015, the club had a total of \$153,907.30 "cash at bank". Of course, there will always be some bills still in the pipeline. These funds are held in the following accounts:

The three term deposits are a "sinking fund" to cover future major expenses such as repainting, replacing carpets, carpark repairs, replacing airconditioners, etc. Our building is now eight years old and we are starting to have to expend money on minor repairs and updates. Fortunately, we are in a sound financial position to do so.

- Zone Qualifying Round for Grand National Open Teams on Sunday 21st August 2016.

Once confirmed, these will be included in our program book and added to the club website. You should also check the "Zones" section of the QBA website for more details.

Groundnut Soup (Recipe provided by Pam Gebbett)

Fry onions chopped in small amount of oil. Add chopped vegetables mushrooms, tomatoes, (any old boots lying around), good dollop of tomato puree, Worcestershire sauce, Magi sauce, soy sauce.

Add stock, either home made or bought stuff and bring to the boil, simmer until vegetables are cooked. Cool down before blending with a magic stick, add salt, pepper and a good pinch of chilli powder.

Winners are Grinners

The "Monthly Winner" awards are displayed on the noticeboard and on the club website. This is a good way to celebrate the high performing players in each session and also provide additional green masterpoints to those players who play regularly in club sessions. They are officially called "**multisession individual eclectic events**".

Here is how it works:

- They are a <u>multisession</u> event combining the overall scores of all your sessions on a given day in the month that have not already been counted in other events.
- They are an **individual** event so that you are not locked out of a monthly award because you are a social butterfly who plays with different people. If you happen to play with the same partner all the time and win then you will share the combined masterpoints for first and second.
- They are an <u>eclectic</u> event which means that your best X scores are counted out of Y sessions. In a typical month there might be 4 sessions available and your best 3 of these scores are counted. If only 3 sessions are available then your best 2 scores are counted. Thus you can miss one session or have a bad day and still be in the monthly competition. Only pairs events are counted in these eclectics not teams.

A Few Directing Matters

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Club Program

We are in the process of developing the playing schedule and the Program Booklet for 2016, and at a recent joint meeting of the Management Committee and Tournament Subcommittee, the following were considered:

- We have been granted 33 red masterpoint sessions for 2016 and these will be distributed amongst the Open sessions in the club throughout the year (eg not at Restricted nor Supervised sessions).
- Move the Beginners Supervised session and Thursday morning Restricted session to Friday morning.
- ~ ~ ~ ~ ~ ~ ~ ~ Reduce the number of multi-session events unless it is a major competition. (In other words, have more single sessions for Social play).
 - Work towards greater consistency in the number of boards played in each session (eg target for Thursday night is 24-27, Regular session is 30-33, etc)
 - Move towards grading each of the larger sessions. The grading will be gentle and will depend on the playing strength of the overall field. A single field will be used for major competitions.

Avoiding an Interrogation (or how to survive one)

I'll explain this article by way of some examples (some real, some modified to protect the innocent and some made up to make a point) and in each case we assume I am sitting South.

Case 1: Not enough information

As South, I open 1H. West overcalls 2H. My partner, North, correctly asks East the meaning of the 2H call and is told "Michaels".

Now, the problem is the general understanding of Michaels is 5-5 in the other major and a minor with typically 7-11 HCP. As the hand is played we belatedly discover that West was 5-◆ 5 but had 2 HCP. There is nothing wrong with • them having a system that allows this – but they must disclose it!! The QBA System

Regulations tell a player that they must describe their partnership agreement NOT just 🖌 give a name of a system.

Case 2: A bit more information

Same auction but this time the explanation comes back "Michaels, could be weak could be strong". This is still not enough. The explanation should be short and complete Perhaps something like "Shows 5 spades and 5 of a minor. Can be as low as 2 points. If partner has more than XX points then later they will".

Case 3: Pulling teeth

Same auction 1H-2H-question.

Answer comes back "Michaels"

Partner asks "what's that"

Answer comes back "5-5"

Partner asks "what's that"

Answer comes back "5 spade and 5 of minor"

Partner asks "how many points"

Answer comes back "7-11"

Partner asks "Can he have a void"

Partner asks "How many hearts does he have" This sequence can be fixed at step one by as clear an explanation as possible. This would avoid the sequence starting to lead towards an interrogation by my partner (which is not allowed).

Case 4: I forget

This time it is poor me. As South I open 1H, Leftie passes and my partner calls 4C. I am stumped. Then the sequence starts ... They ask "what's that"

"I don't know. I think it has a special meaning but I have forgotten. We better call the Director"

The Director arrives, and in a nice gentle manner guides me away from the table, my partner explains our system to the opponents, I come back and we continue an enjoyable game.

Case 5: I Dunno

I'm in a similar situation to last time, except now the auction goes 1H-pass-4D-question. They ask "What's that"

"I don't know, it is not part of our system".

They ask "But what's that. You must know"

"It has no meaning in our system. Partner, appears to have made up a call".

- They ask "Is it a cue bid or a control ask"
- "I don't know what they are"
- ... and the interrogation continues.

This is NOT ACCEPTABLE. We do not interrogate people. If a player has genuinely forgotten their system they will tell you and you call the Director, or they will realise as the hand is played and will call the Director.

If a partnership does not have an agreement on a particular call, then that is the rub of the green. The auction or play continues and the score stands.

The answer in all these cases is that we should call for the Director as soon as the communication between the asker and responder appears to be failing.

When I say call for the Director, I mean in a gentle polite voice, something like "Director please". Bellowing or screeching for the Director will put everyone on edge and really is in breach of Law 74.

Ask nice, answer nice, play nice.
