

## **Masterpoint Secretary's Report**

In September, I processed results for 43 sections from 33 sessions yielding 138.60 green and 25.82 red masterpoints. At the end of September, the ABF decided how many red masterpoint sessions we would be allocated for 2026. It is based on the number of green masterpoints we awarded in the period October-24 to September-25. It was a big September, so we just ticked over to 29 sessions for 2026 – down from the 30 in 2025 (because we have been playing slightly less bridge).

There was a bit of red point give-and-take in the September masterpoints for our club. The club masterpoints were correct but the wrong file was loaded to the event organisers for the Australia's Bridge Day out event from Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> September. ## **Loyalty**

I am probably touching a nerve in saying this (but only a bit). I want to talk about the many facets of "loyalty" in the bridge world.

#### **Loyalty to Partner**

This is the most significant one. There is an expected loyalty to our regular playing partner.

- Occasionally they are mirror images of us in bidding and play standard, in temperament, in their preference of the sessions and events that they like to play in; and sometimes not.
- The mirror image scenario is rare, but a bit of compromise on both sides works wonders and we see many partnerships endure for years, at the table and as friends.
- Often, they start when the two of you emerge from lessons together, sometimes when an experienced player adopts a novice, sometimes your regular partner might leave Toowoomba and you "go shopping" for a new partner.
- It gets sad when one partner might be (bridge) fading a bit. Many partnerships continue but some eventually go their separate ways. It requires great tact when this occurs.

#### **Loyalty to the System**

• It is best that you work on a basic system (typically the one you were taught). I have seen a number of partnerships strained because one person is faithful to the system whereas the other wants to adopt something new every time someone else says they got a good score because we do XXX.

#### Loyalty to your club

- In a small town it is not too much of an issue, and in Toowoomba there are two clubs that are closely aligned and many people members of both clubs. In other towns/cities this is not the case.
- Some people just jump from club to club chasing the shiny red and gold masterpoints and this is tough on a club's regular members. Some people never play at club XYZ but then grumble that XYZ never supports our congresses. I admit this is mainly from some clubs in the southern states, but it does happen.

#### Loyalty to a session

• Back to the Toowoomba club and referring to Tuesday daytime, Tuesday night, Thursday night and Friday afternoon – these are small sessions and they suffer if someone is away then their regular partner just doesn't play. If would help all our friends and keep these sessions viable if we went out and found someone new to play to "keep the numbers up". If you need help with finding a fill-in partner you can approach Kathy for Tuesdays, Denise for Tuesday nights, Chris for Thursday nights and Ian or John for Friday afternoons.

## Winners are Grinners

The "Monthly Winners" are recognised as the "individual" winner of <u>eclectic</u> multisession events. These events combine of all the green masterpoint sessions in a month that have not already counted toward a competition. If there are three available sessions then your best two scores are counted (shows as 2/3), if there are four available sessions then your best three scores are counted (3/4) and if there are five available sessions then your best four scores might be counted (4/5). If there are two available sessions, then they are treated as an eclectic event (best 2/2). If there are five days in the month, then we usually combine two of these (see the bridge diary) as a "<u>Two-Weekly</u>" and additional masterpoints are awarded to the top half of those whose partnerships played both days. The remaining three days are scored as an eclectic with (2/3).

#### **CONVENOR REPORT**

Entries opened in late July and those for the Pairs and Teams events were filled within two weeks. A full complement of 60 Pairs and 30 Teams were maintained to play in the Congress. During the period leading up to the event, I received several phone calls from players asking could they be put on waiting lists in both the pairs and teams events. Vacancies were quickly filled when pairs or teams withdrew by those on stand-by. Two away players, independently, had contacted me to say that they would be in Toowoomba over the weekend and were available to play if I needed a player at short notice.
